II. Adoption of Meeting Minutes and Meeting Agenda

IV. Update on the Identification of Lead Service Line Replacements Experts

- Randy Speck: more difficult than anticipated, Valerie Baron and Randy Speck will work on it.
- This will be a standing agenda item

V. Review of Infrastructure Bill

- The Build Back Better Plan was a legislative framework proposed by President Biden prior to his inauguration comprised of three parts, showing the relevant items related to drinking water and lead:
 - o American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA):
 - (1) \$65 billion slated for FY21-FY24, provided to cities/states/territories based on population
 - (2) Key goals to pursue transformative policy initiatives and fill critical budget gaps.

- (3) To date, the District received nearly \$3.3 billion, split into capital investment and specific recovery grants.
- (4) \$30 million for lead service line replacements over the next three years, distributed and determined by DOEE.
- o American Jobs Plan (AJP)
 - (1) Signed into law as the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) November 15, 2021
 - (2) Investment of \$1.2 trillion over 10 years \$284 billion for surface transportation and \$268 billion for all other critical infrastructure needs.
 - (3) FY22 allotments for drinking and clean water state revolving funds (SRFs).
 - (4) Infrastructure Bill allocates \$143.3 million for lead service line replacements over the next five years, for public and private side costs.
- American Families Plan (AFP).
- DC Water's Lead Free DC Plan
 - o DC Water's plan to replace all lead service lines in the District by 2030.
 - o Estimated to cost \$1.1 billion
 - o DC Water has committed \$628.8 million to this work

VI. Review of Third-Party Cost Study

- Valerie Baron noted that DC Water's estimate for the Lead Free DC Plan of a billion seem high, a report created by an expert engineer with knowledge of the water sector, which had a mean estimate \$142 million and a high estimate of \$228 million. Points of disconnection include using numbers from emergency as a basis for estimates, not taking into account that over time efficiencies are gained, and the numbers drop.
- Valerie Baron will circulate her testimony from June.

 - o Share the public notice and other relevant materials with ANCs.

 - Receive confirmation from Council if the plan for the removal and replacement of all lead water service lines in the District by 2030 can include protective measures of recommendations that will aid in the protection against lead in drinking water.
 - o Provide a prospective plan of action based on proposed budget.
- Marueen Schmelling will:
 - o Define in writing how lead service lines are identified in the District.
- Task Force members will:
 - O Continue to identify District agencies that can aid in the development of the lead service line plan to the Council.
